



AlUla Railway


The AlUla Railway is located in the north of the County, within the highly sensitive UNESCO World Heritage Site of Hegra.

The Ottoman Empire constructed it between 1900 and 1908 to connect Damascus to Medina and it was operational until 1920.

The remnants of the station are of significant historical importance to AlUla and are key to long-term tourism plans.


Dadan

Dadan is located in the west of the County in the AlUla Valley and is the oldest civilization in AlUla, with more than a dozen tombs.

Historically, Dadan served as the capital of the Dadanite and Lihyanite kingdoms during the 1st millennium BCE, making it a significant archaeological and cultural site for the region.

Currently the site of live archaeological excavations, a key feature of the site is the seated lion sculptures that mark the famous Lion Tombs.

Dadan is a highly sensitive heritage protection area, and a site of exceptional cultural significance due to the ongoing excavations at the site.

Gharameel Nature Reserve

The Gharameel Nature Reserve is part of a protected nature reserve in the north of AlUla County.

It is a remote desert steppe area featuring dramatic rock formations sculpted by natural erosion over millennia, as well as sand dunes, plateaus, and diverse desert flora and fauna.

Gharameel Nature Reserve is one of the first in Saudi Arabia to be designated as an International Dark Sky Park, making it a prime tourism destination for stargazing for the County; under this designation, it must be kept free from light pollution.

Hegra


Hegra is the main heritage site in AlUla and is situated in the north of the County.

It was the second-largest Nabatean Kingdom (after Petra in Jordan) and served as a major trading hub during the 1st century BCE.

It is primarily a desert landscape surrounded by sandstone mountains and rock formations.

It was designated as a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 2008, the first Saudi Arabian location to have that distinction; as a result, it is subject to strict heritage protection guidelines.

The location features more than 110 tombs carved into sandstone outcrops with intricate façades and inscriptions, including the iconic Alfreed Tomb.

Jabal Ikmah


Jabal Ikmah is an archaeological site situated in the north-west of the County, near to Dadan, the capital of Dadanite and Lihyanite Kingdoms. It served as a key cultural and religious hub during the 1st century BCE.

It is located in a narrow canyon and is known for its extensive collection of ancient inscriptions and rock art, making it historically and culturally significant.

Often referred to as Saudi Arabia's open-air library, it sits within the Jabal Ikmah Heritage Protection Area, a site of exceptional archaeological significance.



Khaybar

Khaybar


Khaybar is a unique town site created from desert volcanic activity. It is located about 200 km south of AlUla in Khaybar County.

Khaybar is listed as a location of high Sensitivity due to its historic nature; the ecology supports an abundance of native plant and animal life. The natural conditions of freshwater springs and 'wadis' create an oasis that has encouraged waves of settled and nomadic human activity.

There are also lava fields, ancient forts, palm groves and archaeological ruins.

Old Town

The Old Town is part of the AlUla Old Town Village, a wellpreserved historic village in the centre of the County.

There are nearly 900 houses built from mud, a five-km stretch from north to south, as well as restored shops, town squares and a citadel.

The Old Town is part of the Cultural Oasis District, which is a sensitive development and restoration zone.

These natural rock formations are sculpted by nature to appear as if they are swaying in unison.

They are located in the Raggasat Valley within the protected Sharaan Natural Reserve.

Rainbow Rock

Rainbow Rock

This rock formation is so called because it appears as an arch or a rainbow with two clouds.

The location lies within the protected and highly sensitive Harrat Uwayridh Nature Reserve.

Sharaan Nature Reserve

The Sharaan Nature Reserve covers over 1,500 sq km and is located in the North of the County; it represents a typical natural landscape of the AlUla area, which is shaped by sandstone; massive erosion has formed a complex network of valleys, gorges and canyons.

This reserve is the site of ongoing efforts to restore its sensitive ecosystem, which in turn allows the preservation and protection of endangered animals such as Arabian wolves, gazelles and large-eared red foxes; there are plans to reintroduce the critically endangered Arabian Leopard in the future.



Tayma

Tayma

Tayma is a historic oasis town located north-east of AlUla with a rich legacy dating back thousands of years. Tayma is highly sensitive due to its historic value.

Known for its deep archaeological significance and ancient water wells, Tayma was once a vital stop along the incense and trade routes that connected Arabia with Mesopotamia and the Levant.

The area is home to remarkable sites such as the Tayma Stone and Qasr Al-Ablaq, offering a window into the lives of ancient civilizations that thrived in the Arabian Peninsula.

Wadi Nkhalah

The location lies within the designated protected area of the Wadi Nkhalah Nature Reserve.

It covers approximately 2,452 sq km and is part of the broader efforts to preserve the County's natural heritage.

There are important inscriptions all along the Wadi, including a site that is acknowledged in the UNESCO "Memory of the World" list; the rock faces are of geological significance.

Elephant Rock

Known in Arabic as Jabal AlFil, this is a natural rock formation shaped like an elephant that measures 52 m tall.

The location lies within a natural landscape that is planned to become part of the Rock Formation landscape protected area in the future.

Elephant Rock is open to visitors.

Fadhla Dunes

The Fadhla Dunes are located in the south-west of AlUla.

The location is an untouched sand dune in pristine condition, which must be preserved.



Harrat Uwayrid

Harrat Uwayrid

This location is in the Harrat Uwayridh Nature Reserve, in the north-west of the County. It is a vast volcanic plateau that is recognisable by its dramatic black basalt landscapes and sweeping desert vistas. Spanning approximately 180 km in length and 90 km in width, this ancient lava field features scoria cones, expansive lava flows, and tuff cones, offering a fascinating glimpse into the region's geological history.

The Harrat Viewpoint, situated about 30 minutes by car from AlUla's Old Town, offers panoramic views of the AlUla Oasis, Dadan, and the surrounding desert landscapes.

Beyond its geological significance, Harrat Uwayrid is also a site of ecological and archaeological importance. The Harrat Uwayrid Reserve, the largest natural reserve in the AlUla Governorate, is home to 19 species of endangered animals, 43 species of birds—including 8 species of prey—and 55 species of rare plants.


The location is on the open plains near to Hegra in the north-east of AlUla.

It features "Serengeti-style" trees and barren desert areas.

Due to the open plain landscape and its proximity to Hegra, any production in this location may have a visual impact on Hegra from long distances.

The location lies within the protected Sharaan Natural Reserve and features both sandstone and volcanic rocks. It is quite remote with no vehicle or pedestrian access.


Maraya, Ashar Estate

Maraya is a state-of-the-art multi-purpose entertainment venue that is known for its mirrored walls that reflect the natural surroundings of the Ashar Estate, in which it is located.

Ashar Estate lies in an open valley surrounded by mountains and dunes within the Harrat Uwayridh Nature Reserve. It is home to Maraya as well as Banyan Tree and Habitas resort hotels.




Oasis

- This location is part of the Cultural Oasis District, which is a sensitive development and restoration zone.
- The Oasis is a 6 km "green belt" that runs through the County, and represents traditional farms, full of palm trees and pathways.
- There are both government and private businesses such as restaurants in the Oasis, which is part of the RCU plan for tourism.

Wadi AlNa'am is a valley that features both sandstone and volcanic rock formations.

It is currently a site for adventure activities.
